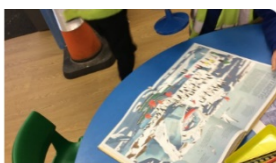
Nursery

More forest school fun in year 1 this week!!



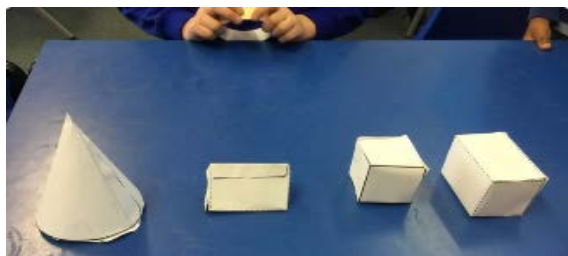
Year 2 News
