Does your child get to school on time every day?

There is a link between good school attendance and high-level attainment. Regardless of the reason, if your child is absent from school it will impact their learning.

Parents/carers are legally responsible for ensuring their child attends school on time every day.

Routine

The easiest way to ensure your child attends school on time every day is to establish a GOOD MORNING ROUTINE.

If mornings are hectic in your household, prepare as much as possible the night before.

Reporting an Absence It is the parent/carers responsibility to notify school if their child is absent. A NUST be provided. Please ensure you contact the school to advise of your on the school to advise of your bild's absence by 9.30 am on the day of absence. Medical Appointments

Ensure that, where possible, hospital, doctor and dental appointments are made outside of school hours. Where this is not possible, the amount of school time missed must be kept to a minimum and medical evidence may be required.

Persistent Absences

Any child with attendance below 90%, regardless of the reason of the absence, is considered to be a persistent absentee. This equates to just 2 days each


month. Statistics show that persistent absentees are less likely to achieve their full potential.

Unauthorised Learning Leave in Term Time (Holidays)

Children are **not** entitled to holidays during term time. Family holidays should be taken during school holiday periods.

To request learning leave during term time due to exceptional circumstances, ask the school office for a Learning Leave of Absence Form (with as much notice as possible).

Fines may be issued where unauthorized learning leave has been taken during termtime.

YOUR LEGAL RESPONSIBILITY

If your child does not attend school regularly (over 90%) theLocal Authority can take action against you. This can be

through a Fixed Penalty Notice (fine) or a summons to appear at court.

What is a fixed Penalty Notice?

The Anti-Social Behaviour act 2003 introduced legislation forLocal Authorities to issue Fixed Penalty Notice to parents/carers of pupils who have unauthorised absences fromschool.

A Penalty Notice can be issued for two reasons:

- If a holiday is taken during term time without the per-mission of the headteacher
- If a pupil has unauthorised absence from school and their parent/carer fails to co-operate with school staffand/or other professionals to improve the situation

What are the fines?

£120 per parent/carer (reduced to £60 if paid within a timely manner). If the £120 is not paid within the time frame given a summons can be issued to appear in court. The Local Authority can decide whether to issue a summons to court in-stead of a Penalty Notice.

Too ill to attend school?

Children can attend school with minor ailments such as toothache, headache, stomach-ache, cold, sore throat etc. Over the counter medicines can be given before school. School will contact you if they become too ill to remain in school.

Children should be off school for 48 hours if they have diarrohea or a sickness bug. However, if you're child has managed a day without being sick or having loose stools then speak to the school office as your child may be able to return to school before the 48-hour time frame.

If you are unsure how long your child should be absent with an illness speak to your child's school, your doctor or pharmacist for advice.
