Please ensure your child comes to school with a coat and wellies as the children do go out in all weathers. Wellies need to be in a labelled carrier bag.



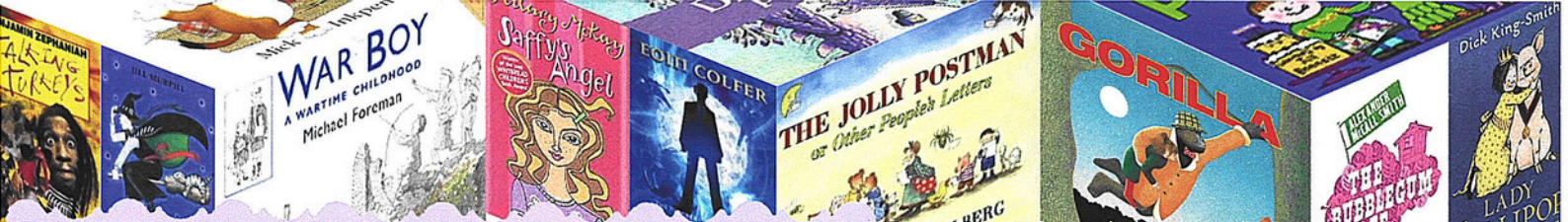
Community

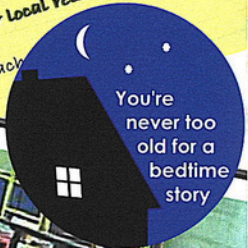

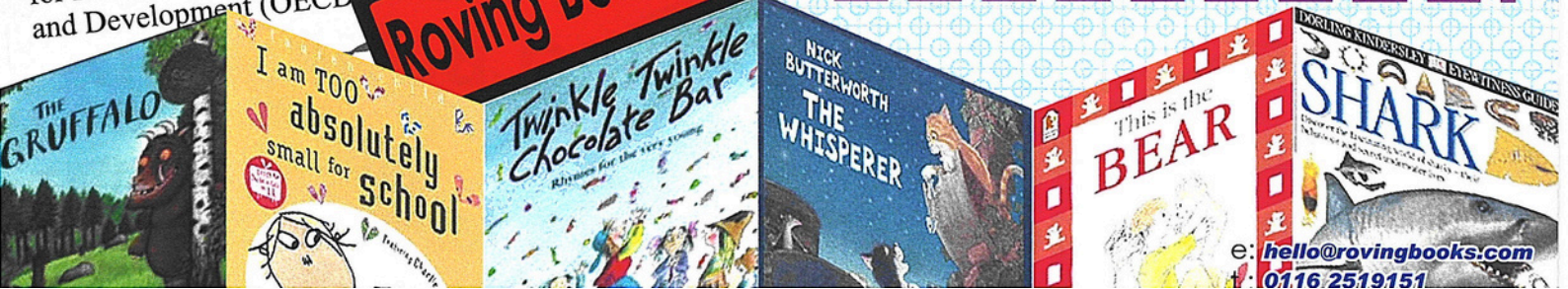
